
WHO Patient Safety - making health care safer

"The safety of health care is now a major global concern.

May 2017

Delivering safer care in complex, pressurized and fast-moving environments is one of the greatest challenges facing health care today.

Clear policies, organizational leadership capacity, data to drive safety improvements, skilled health care professionals and effective involvement of patients in their care, are all needed to ensure sustainable and significant improvements in the safety of health care."





2006: Strategic Approach EU Commission

"Therefore, in order to ensure effective use of scarce resources and European coordination of activities in each of these areas, a new approach will be considered to taking this work forward within a single integrated framework involving all Member States.

This approach would have the benefit of **bringing the key players together** without creating separate subgroups or projects which could potentially overlap and result in ineffectiveness.

Moreover, an umbrella mechanism would ensure that all Member States and stakeholders would

have the possibility of being a partner in this work."



Patient Safety Working Group

Characteristics:

Facilitated by a member



- No translators, "broken English" as the European language
- Participation of all Member States and all stakeholders including WHO
- Working culture based on common sense, search for solutions (not regulations) in a very friendly athmosphere



COUNCIL CONCLUSIONS
Brussels, 1 December 2014

Council conclusions on patient safety and quality of care, including the prevention and control of healthcare associated infections and antimicrobial resistance

Employment, Social policy, Health and Consumer affairs Council meeting
Brussels. 1 December 2014

The Council adopted the following conclusions:

"THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

- RECALLS that under Article 168 of the Treaty on the Functioning high level of human health protection shall be ensured in the defir all Union policies and activities, that Union action, which shall con shall be directed towards improving public health, that the Union s between the Member States in the field of public health and, if ne their action, and fully respect the responsibilities of the Member S and delivery of health services and medical care;
- RECALLS the Council conclusions on common values and principles in European Union Health Systems adopted on 2 June 2006¹, and particularly the overarching values of universality, access to good quality care, equity and solidarity;
- RECALLS that the Annual Growth Survey 2014 highlights the need for the development of
 active inclusion strategies that include broad access to affordable and high-quality health
 services, also with regard to achieving the objectives of Europe 2020;

What is the idea of the treaty of Lisbon?

Treaty of Lisbon 168, 2:

"The Commission may, in close contact with the Member States, take any useful initiative to promote such coordination, in particular initiatives aiming at the establishment of guidelines and indicators, the organisation of exchange of best practice, and the preparation of the necessary elements for periodic monitoring and evaluation. The European Parliament shall be kept fully informed.."

Bypassing agenda of the EU Commission

The EU Commission promoted Patient Safety as a special issue two times besides the PSQCWG:

1. The annual Union work programme for European standardization

Brussels, 31.7.2013 COM(2013) 561 final


- **→** 2.2.19. Healthcare services: specific areas for ESO mandates might be foreseen for horizontal aspects like patient safety and registration
- 2. Creation of a new "Expert Group" (future agenda 14.10.2014)

Without any communication with the WG!!!!



Strategic Approach EU Commission – old and new

Old: 2006
